## Panthers Are Lone Unbeaten Team In U. S. As Season Ends

By virtue of being the nation's only undefeated team, although once tied, the Prairie View Panthers rank as the nation's No. 1 football team for the 1958 season, according to the final Associated Negro Press ratings based on regular season per-

Playing against top competition in nearly every game, Prairie View opened the season with a 14-14 tile against the Jackson Tigere, then rolled to seven straight vistories to end the season with a 7-0-1 record.

The Panthers' victims included Texas Southern, 26-19, Grambling, 44-0, Arkansas A. M. and N. 37-13, Texas Cottege 43-0, Mississippi Vocational 59-14, Wiley 13-0, and Southern 20-14. Prairie View spotted Routhern 14 points, then came hack to win. This victory carried the No. 1 spot.

Offense jumped ahead of the defense during the 1958 season. The highest scoring team was Southern with 300 points in 10 games. Florida A. and M. with 357 in eight games and Prairie View with 356 in eight games were tops in average points per game.

The best defensive team was Southern, giving up only 71 points in 10 games. Playing minor competition St. Augustine, 6-3-0, permit-

ted only 48 points in eight tilts for the best average among all schools. Wiley scored the most points in a game, slaughtering Alcorn 74-0. Chambling blasted Paul Quinn 72-8.
