Declines \$4,500 Fisk U. Offer To Return To Washington

DR. LOCKE, 3 OTHERS FIRED BY DR. DURKEE

Resulting Resentment Of Alumni Caused Durkee Himself To Quit

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Before he left for New York from where he sailed Saturday for Europe, Dr. Alain Leroy Locke confirmed reports that he would return to Howard University as a professor of philosophy next year.

He declined a \$4.500 from Pisk to accept his old post.
Howard University alumni regard the re-employment of Dr. Locke as a vindication of their fight in behalf of Dr. Locke, Alonzo H. Brown, former professor of mathematics; Metz T. P. Lochard, former assistant professor of French and Orlando C. Thornton, former instructor in finance and business organization, whose services were discontinued June 30, 1925.

The trustees decided to dismiss

The trustees decided to dismiss these professors in accordance with recommendations made to them by Robert Josselyn Leonard, director of the school of education, teachers college. Columbia University, who made a survey of the scadenic departments of Howard University. He recommended a program of retrenchment.

The resulting resentment of Howard alumni caused Durkee himself to resign.

Dr. Locke is a former Rhodes scholar and an author.
Dr. Locke is accredited as an observer to the Commission on Native Labor and the Permanent Mandates Commission of the League of Nations, which will be in session in Geneva in July and in September during the meeting of the League of Nassembly.
