MILWAUKEE. Wisconsin - A black woman became the top elected Democrat in the state of Wisconsin last week, when she easily defeated her Republican opnopent for Secretary of State.

Atty. Vet R. Phillips made history in Wisconsin, as she became the first black to be elected to a statewide office.

Unofficial election returns showed Phillips outpolling Fredric Seeledt by a 562,089 to 514,729 margin with 2,735 of the state's 3,414 wards reporting.

A former Milwaukee council member and judge. Phillips indicated she will be an active secretary and will waste no time in learning her new duties.

"I'm going to spend the next few
