## Dollree Mapp Nabbed; Naughty Books Found

Attractive Dollree Mapp, ex-wife of boxer Jimmy Bivins, and ex-girl friend of Lightheavyweight champion Archie Moore, this week got her picture into the police Bertillon files.

The nationally publicized and glamorous young woman of 29, whose pictures have appeared in publications across the country, made the police photo gallery for the first time, though she ran afoul of the law exactly three years ago.

MISS MAPP, of 14705 Milverton Ave., on the fringe of Shaker Heights, made new photo history after being charged with the possession of obscene literature and policy slips in Police Court, Monday,

Obscene literature is a felony charge, under State Law.

THE CHARGES, set for a hearing on June 25. followed a police raid on Miss Mapp's residence, led by Sgt. Carl J. Delau and Patrolmen Thomas J. Dever and Michael J. Haney, members of a special investigating squad under Lt. Martin L. Cooney.

Arrested three years ago, elmost to the day, and charged with possession of Clearing House slips —a bundle of them—Miss Mapp was fined \$100 and costs, but failed to get "mugged" on that rap.

Arrested with her in the raid at her 2-family residence last Thursday was Virgil Overtree, 34, of 1355 E. 115, who was released without charge after police interrogation.

Miss Mapp, who denies all knowledge of, either the steamer trunk loaded with paraphernalia from the California Gold Policy House, or the obscene pictures confiscated, had put up stiff resistance to police efforts to enter her home.

IT TOOK a search warrant before the defiant Dollree became the acquiescent hostess, following a police tip that information about a bombing might be gained through the visit to her home.

The original investigation followed the bombing of the Mt. Pleasant home of Donald (The Kid) reputed young numbers baron, at 3713 E. 151 St., after

which a number of arrests and charges of blackmail were placed against five persons named by King.

Miss Mapp denied she knew, or had any connection with Alex (Shondor) Birns, key figure in this new numbers investigation, but police are continuing the investigation of all suspects in the

case.

POLICE REPORTED Miss Mapp called an attorney, Walter L. Greene, who arrived at her home during the police raid, but she was represented in Police Court, Monday, by Atty. A. L. Kearns, who asked for the continuance until June 25.

Elijah Abercrombie, last to be arrested on the blackmail charges, which involved five others, will go to court on June 12, along with the others, for arraignment on the blackmail charges.
