

DR. CARRIE GEORGE IS LISTED IN "WHO'S WHO"

Dr. Carrie L. George, the well-known educator, clergywoman and lecturer is listed in the first edition of "Who's Who Among Black Americans." The book was recently cited as one of the outstanding references of 1976 by the American Library Association.

Listed in this volume of notables, Dr. George joins such outstanding personalities as Barbara Jordan, Marian Anderson, Pearl Bailey, Sadie Tanner Alexander, Alex Haley, Sammy Davis, to name a few.

Dr. George holds the distinction of being one of the few trained ordained Baptist Clergywoman who holds five earned degrees (including The Ph. D.) and one conferred doctorate in the fields of mathematics, business administration, education, theological education, and guidance and counseling psychology. She is an alumna of Clark College, Atlanta University, Gammon Theological Seminary, New York University, Gregg College, Ohio State University, The

Hartford Seminary Foundation, Garret-Northwestern University and Famous Writers School. She is widely travelled throughout the States and abroad.

Dr. George has taught on the faculties of the colleges of the Atlanta University System, Gorham College (Me.), and Georgia State University where she is presently employed. She has been a high school mathematics teacher, an Administrative Assistant to the Atlanta Concentrated Employment Program Monitor and Curriculum Specialist and Senior Counselor for Economic Systems Corporation. Before tutoring was popular, she opened "George's Tutorial Institute" to give adults an opportunity to further their training. She shares her training and experiences unstintingly through her professions as well as through civic and religious organizations. She often says, "I keep my learning experiences up-dated in order to share with those who have not had the opportunities I have had."

Dr. George is a native Georgian, the widow of the late Rev. D. T. George, and the mother of two young adults.
