ACTION ON RESOLUTIONS

Favorable action by the convention will be recommended by the resolutions committee for support of national and state FEPC measures, anti-lynching and anti-poll tax bills, legislation for equal educational opportunities throughout the south.

Also proposed will be full participation by the organization in the national non-partisan lobby of Greek letter organizations in Washington, D.C., and moral and financial support to the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

The Zetas have 120 chapters with a total membership of 3,000 throughout the United States and last year contributed more than \$1,000 to the NAACP through the grand chapter in addition to \$100 each from the local chapters.
