Many Hundred Delegates Expected to Session to Be Held in This City

The National Medical Association is cians, surgeons, dentists and pharma-cists of the United States and West indies. This body was to have met-in the city of Memphis, Tenn., August 28, 29 and 36, 1917, but three months ago when preparations were being made by the local physicians of Mem-phis for the entertainment of the Na-tional body, a brutal lynching took place in the city of Memphis. The victim was decapitated and his head thrown in the midst of the assembled professional men with a warning that the National Medical Association was not wanted in the city of Memphis. The Bluff City Medical Society which had extended the invitation to the Na-tional body to meet at Memphis, Im-mediately took steps withdrawing the invitation. It was then up to the Exe-cuive Board to find a suitable place of meeting for the 1917 session. The professions of Philadelphia, represent-ed by the Philadelphia, represent-ued by the Philadelphia, represent-ued by the Philadelphia, represent-ted by the Philadelphia Academy of Medicine, and the professions consti-tuting the Northeastern Medical So-clety (including New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania and Connecticut) were asked to entertain the Associa-tion and unanimously agreed. The following men were appointed by the two societies to form the executive committee: From Philadelphia Aca-demy, Dr. Jos. T. Howard. From Northeastern Medical Society, Dr. Benj, Withers, of New York; Dr. C. A. Lewis; Dr. Thos. G. Coates. With thest shan three months to pre-pare for the entertainment of three or four hundred men and women from all parts of the country the men of Philadelphia railled and are now com-pleting arrangements for one of the best sessions in the history of the National Medical Association. The general sessions will be held at the Y. M. C. A., 1724 Christian street, to which the public is invited. Every-body is requested to be present at Union Baptist church, on Fizwater street, above 19th, Tuesday evening at Union Baptist church.
