FOREIGN BORN MUST CARRY CARDS AT ALL TIMES

The McCarran-Walter Immigration Act will become effective Dec. 24, 1952, and many of the provisions have aroused opposition from numerous organizations and individual citizens.

1. All, non-citizens must notify the Department of Justice within ten days of any change of address.

Forms are obtainable from Post Offices.

2. At all times non-citizens male and female, must carry on their persons their Alien Registration Cards, which constitute proof of their legality of residence. They can be sent to jail for three months and be deported if they are found without cards. Under Alien Registration Act of 1940 if cards have been mislaid or lost, can be obtained from the Department of Justice after December 24, 1952, a fee of \$5.00 will be charged for the issuance of such card.

RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY GOP WOMEN
